4 FIRST-AID MEASURES

INHALATION

Vapours may cause drowsiness and dizziness. Move the exposed person to fresh air at once. Provide rest, warmth and fresh air. Get medical attention if any discomfort continues.

INGESTION

Rinse mouth thoroughly. Get medical attention. Provide rest, warmth and fresh air.

SKIN CONTACT

Prolonged contact may cause redness and irritation. Wash the skin immediately with soap and water. Do not use solvents or thinners.

EYE CONTACT

May irritate eyes. Make sure to remove any contact lenses from the eyes before rinsing. Promptly wash eyes with plenty of water while lifting the eye lids. Continue to rinse for at least 15 minutes. Get medical attention if any discomfort continues.

EXTINGUISHING MEDIA

Use: Carbon dioxide (CO2). Dry chemicals, sand, dolomite etc. Foam.

SPECIAL FIRE FIGHTING PROCEDURES

Move container from fire area if it can be done without risk. Cool containers exposed to flames with water until well after the fire is out.

UNUSUAL FIRE & EXPLOSION HAZARDS

Extremely flammable. Aerosol cans may explode in a fire.

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SPECIFIC HAZARDS

PROTECTIVE MEASURES IN FIRE

Self contained breathing apparatus and full protective clothing must be worn in case of fire.

6 ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

PERSONAL PRECAUTIONS

Wear protective clothing as described in Section 8 of this safety data sheet.

ENVIRONMENTAL PRECAUTIONS

Avoid discharge to the aquatic environment.

SPILL CLEAN UP METHODS

Extinguish all ignition sources. Avoid sparks, flames, heat and smoking. Ventilate. Once the propellant has completely vented, absorb any remaining liquid in vermiculite, dry sand or earth and place into containers. Containers with collected spillage must be properly labelled with correct contents and hazard symbol.

USAGE PRECAUTIONS

Read and follow manufacturer's recommendations. Keep away from heat, sparks and open flame. Provide good ventilation. Avoid contact with eyes. Wash hands after handling.

STORAGE PRECAUTIONS

Keep away from heat, sparks and open flame. Aerosol cans: Must not be exposed to direct sunlight or temperatures above 50°C.
